Directions to Sprucewood Farm:

From Interstate 89:

Take exit 16 and turn north on Route 7. Pass Costco, on your right and continue north for 2 miles. At the top of the hill you will reach the intersection of Blakely/Severence Roads. Turn left on Blakely Road, like you are heading toward Mallet's Bay. The first right you can make is a dirt road called Poor Farm Road.

Sprucewood Farm is 0.2 miles on your left. You will see a white vinyl fence and a large barn with a green roof.

Sprucewood Farm offers summer riding camp for beginners through intermediate riders. We emphasize building horsemanship skills through developing a relationship with each horse. This improves the riders confidence and overall experience. Even the first-time beginners will enjoy spending extra time getting to know their ponies. The riders will have a morning ride/lesson and an afternoon ride. They will learn all aspects of horse care, parts of the tack, daily grooming as well as preparing for the mini- “show” at the end of the week. Each day, weather permitting, we will end the day with a swim in the pool.

Sprucewood Farm limits the number of riders each week to improve the quality of the camp experience. We keep the ratio of rider to staff member at 1:2. Every rider will be matched to a horse or pony of their level.

What to bring:

- Properly fitting riding helmet
- Closed toe footwear with a heel
- Bathing suit and towel
- Long pants for riding, shorts and flip flops
- Bagged lunch and snack
